*"But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all people.'" Luke 2:10*

- Homemade gifts can be very meaningful and personal.

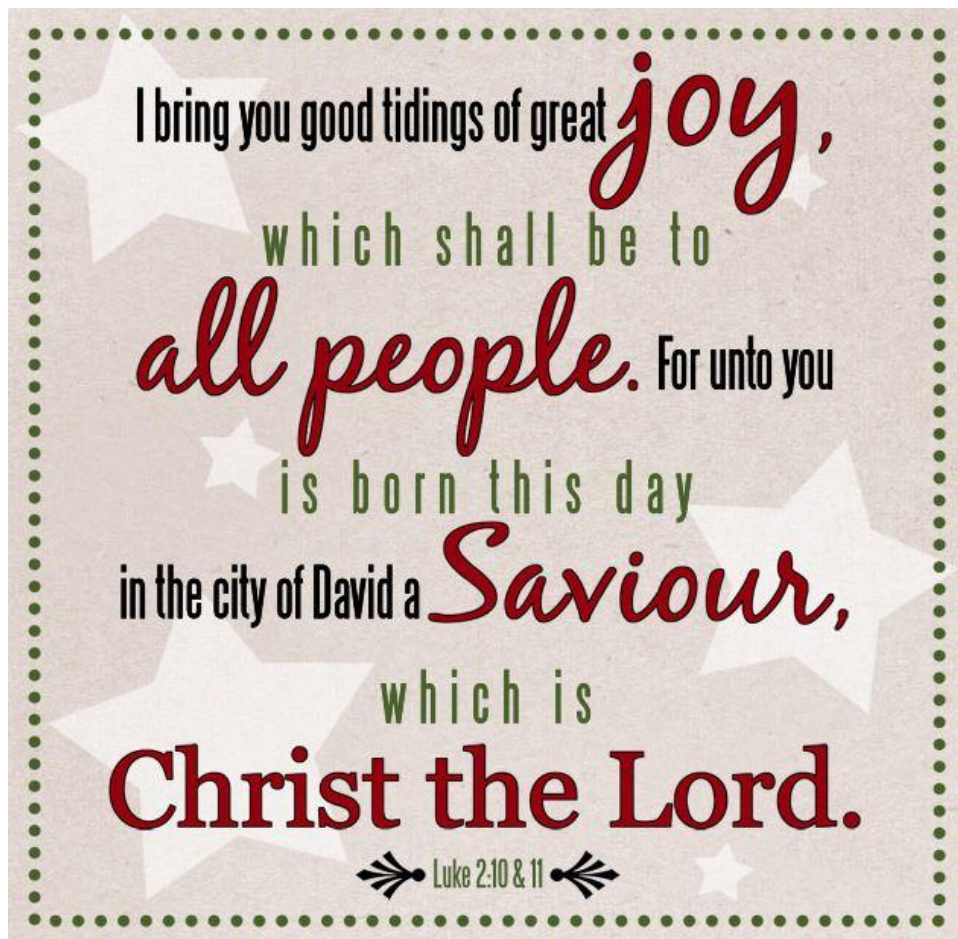
- Maybe a phone call or writing a note would be a great gift for someone.
