Love Without Walls

Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to town and said to the people, "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?"

(John 4:28-29)

February 14 is Valentine's Day and very much associated with showing expressions of love to those we care about. Pick up a box of chocolates, a bouquet of roses, and a card, and all is well. While expressions of love are necessary and appreciated, love is not only shown on special occasions but in daily displays of caring.

Jesus walked with his disciples daily after they were called and chosen, so he could show them how to display love and care in many different forums with different people. Because his disciples were of Jewish descent, they felt that the Messiah's love and care was predominantly for the Jews. However, Jesus showed them care for outsiders or "others" by healing non-Jews or gentiles, and by spreading the gospel and dying on the cross for all persons.

The John passage noted above highlights the occasion when Jesus went to Samaria to have a discussion with a Samaritan woman at a well. For a Jew to interact with a Samaritan, and a woman at that, was against the rules. However, by the end of their conversation she was telling everyone in her town about the Jewish prophet who had taken the time to give her the good news. She felt that God knew her and had sent a word specifically for her, and therefore helped her to understand that God's love was inclusive, not exclusive and unifying, not dividing.

For me, God's love has no limitations or boundaries, and, as Forrest Gump said in the movie by the same name, "You never know what you're going to get." Similarly, as followers of Christ, we never know who God is going to call us to show love to.

Here's To Good Health!

Do you have a heart rhythm problem?

What is an arrhythmia?

Arrhythmias occur when electrical impulses that coordinate your heart beats don't work properly, causing your heat to beat too fast (tachycardia), too slow (bradycardia) or irregularly. Heart arrhythmia may feel like fluttering or racing heart.

We all may feel one of these symptoms occasionally. If your doctor has told you that you do have an arrhythmia here are a few things that can do.

- Avoid alcohol or use only in moderation.
- Avoid stimulants. Be careful with herbal supplements; they can contain stimulants you are unaware of.
- Stop smoking.

- Be careful with caffeine. If you experience symptoms from coffee, you should stop. Usually 1 or 2 cups a day have little effect. Same goes for drinking soda.
- · Be careful with energy drinks. Doctors usu-

ally tell people to avoid them. Along with the caffeine they can also contain other compounds that increase heart rate and blood pressure.

To avoid arrhythmias see your doctor regularly; remember to exercise, remain active, and maintain a healthy weight.

February is Heart Health Month. Take care of your heart both physically and spiritually!

GROCERY CARD UPDATE

Covenant Church has been selling grocery cards on the first and third Sundays of the month for many years. Five percent of the sale of those cards is used by our Outreach team to support missions locally and around the US. Some examples of where the donations go are:

Here are some numbers to consider. Since 2012 we have sold \$234,625 worth of grocery cards, which netted the Outreach team \$11,731.25. However, sales have decreased slightly in the last few years. In 2018 we sold \$33,350, and in 2019 we sold \$25,750. So if you shop at Stauffers, Giant or Weis, remember you can purchase gift cards to use on your future grocery shopping trips while also helping to reach out to others through Covenant Church.
