This Time I'm Going to Do It!

I was watching the Today show earlier this week and noticed that most of the topics centered on making and following through on New Year's resolutions. In the past, I have made resolutions that started out great on January 1, but by March or April I had "fallen off the wagon." When this would occur, I would feel disappointed momentarily, but would then ease my discomfort by saying, "I will try again next year."

I went through this for many years until something changed for me. For some people it is easy to create a strategy and follow through, while others may start strong and slowly fall away as I did. The apostle Paul in his letter to the church at Philippi suggests that the key to following through is to give credit to Christ for each of our accomplishments on the journey.

For both the things we find difficult as well as the things that come easily to us, we must give Christ all the glory. Philippi was a town where many retired Roman soldiers resided, and they were very loyal to the government. But now that they were followers of Christ, Paul suggested that they must have a similar if not a greater love for Christ who was their spiritual



savior and leader. How do we give Christ the credit and accomplish our goals simultaneously? Let me share three ways of focusing my thinking in order to accomplish my desires. Hopefully they may be of help to you.

First we have to consider how what we want to accomplish in the New Year will further God's kingdom. For example, if you want to return to school, this will help you be a better educated follower of Christ.

Second, we must consider giving God the credit for each step toward reaching this goal. Sometimes people wait to thank God when it's over or complete. I have found it helpful and strengthening to thank God for each small victory along the way.

Finally, if this goal is for your betterment, perhaps it started with God providing the original idea. Entrust that God is by your side with every decision and each step you make, and remember that what God started God is able to finish. The Apostle Paul explains this in these words:

"Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

-Philippians 1:6

50-Year Member Reflections: Bill Kepner

This past November, Covenant recognized its 25-year and 50-year members during Sunday services. Each 50-year member was given a questionnaire as an opportunity to reflect on past memories of Covenant Church. The following reflections are from **Bill Kepner**.

Events that Bill recalls being special to him were participating in church dramas under the leadership of Lloyd Dull, the growth of our Christmas Eve series, the merger with Bethany and the ceremonial march across the parking lot to Covenant, and our 100th Anniversary.

The areas of church life in which Bill became most interested were music and church leadership. "I wanted to lead in any capacity where there was a need," says Bill.

Bill's greatest satisfaction in serving came from being named adult choir director in 1979 and ultimately the director of the music program. He adds, "God blessed me with this opportunity, and it has dramatically changed my life. It allowed me to meet my wife and minister with my family."

Favorite memories of Bill's include all the wonderful Sunday School teachers he had as a child, but he mentions that Ray Wiggins was the most memorable. "When I was in sixth grade, Ray was my first male Sunday School teacher; he told amazing stories, and I love him."

The persons in the church who had a great impact on Bill include his parents, who were such a positive influence and encouraged Bill to become very involved in the church. He also notes how Elvin Wissler was a won-

derful mentor during his teen years. "As an adult," Bill adds, "Jim Work was my favorite teacher, and he gave me the opportunity to teach, which I currently do with the adult elective class. Teaching has helped me grow in my faith tremendously."

Bill's favorite hymn is "Because He Lives," and his favorite passages of scripture are Romans 8:31-32 and Psalm 27:1.

Bill's hope for new ministry at Covenant would be a renewed investment in children, youth, and young adults.

For those considering membership at Covenant, Bill says, "Get into a small group; get connected and involved. The 'church family' will become part of your family, and you will find joy in serving Christ with others."
