From the Pastor's Desk...

On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.



(Matthew 2:11-12)

As a child several important persons in my life discussed the importance of dreams. "People should always have a dream of something more or of something to aspire to," were their encouragements. At one time I dreamed of being a comedian, and on other occasions a basketball star, a professional singer, an actor, and at another time a great preacher and leader like the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Whether I achieved these aspirations or not did not matter as much as having something to aspire to.

According to the Bible, God has spoken to and continues to communicate to people through dreams. As in the case of Jacob and his dream of a ladder from earth to heaven in the Old Testament, it was through a dream God guided him. Joseph interpreted a dream for Pharaoh in the Old Testament and was elevated from prisoner to second in command in Egypt. It is important to have dreams.

In the passage of scripture above, after the magi properly worshipped the Christ and spent some time together in His presence, they were warned in a dream not to return to king Herod with news of the Christ child's whereabouts. In obedience the wise men went home without returning to Herod. In 2019 there are some dreams for our lives and our ministry that God intends to bring into fruition.

What things has your worship experience with Christ wrought that may be leading you to take another route? I believe that now, at the beginning of the new year, is the time to evaluate what personal or spiritual dreams we must pursue and what other concerns we must not return to through God's revelation. In faith we must "Dare to pursue your God inspired dreams in 2019."

Epiphany...What?, Why?, and How?

WHAT is the history behind this holiday? The word epiphany means "manifestation" or "revelation." When Christians talk about Epiphany, we are referring to the three wise men or the Magi's revelation that Jesus was the Christ, the Messiah that Israel had been waiting for (Matthew 2:1-12). On this day, we recognize the wise men's journey to see, worship, and bring gifts to "the one...born king of the Jews" (Matthew 2:2). The festival commemorating Epiphany is Jan. 6 and is also called Three Kings Day. Epiphany celebrates Jesus' outward and visible expression of love for us.

WHY does the Epiphany matter? Christ's birth was a big deal for the wise men, and it is a big deal for us. At its essence, Epiphany celebrates Jesus' outward and visible expression of love in leaving His rightful place in heaven to live as a human and become the sacrifice for our sins. The Magi, wise men who studied the stars and were considered sinners, represent Jesus' ability to draw all types of people to Him. He is a Savior who came for all people, including each one of us.

HOW should I celebrate Epiphany? Epiphany traditions vary from culture to culture. It can be helpful to remember and celebrate significant events in Jesus' life, including the Epiphany. What is important to keep in mind when celebrating any holiday is the reason for and the heart behind the celebration. Rather than acknowledging traditions or rituals because they've always been done, celebrate the meaning of the holiday: Jesus came to earth to save us.

Back in November there was an article in the newspaper about older people and falls. That got me thinking about giving you some tips to help keep you safer in 2019.

No matter your age, no one wants to fall. It can be embarrassing; your pride can be hurt; and, worse, you can be injured. The risk of falling increases as you age, but there is good news... falls can be prevented.

- Exercise Yes, I've talked about this before, but exercise is great to help keep you healthy and can help you keep your balance.
- Use a walker or a cane. Please, folks, please don't be embarrassed to use one of these devices. Make sure you have plenty of room to walk around in your living areas.
- Remove those throw rugs. Yes, I know they make your home look nice, but they can cause you to fall if you catch your foot on the edge of one.
- Use grab bars in the bathroom for getting in and out of the shower or tub.

- Wear good fitting shoes. Be sure they are non-slip.
- Don't forget to drink plenty of water. Yes, I know that will make you go to the bathroom more often, but it is a healthy thing to do.
- Don't go rushing to answer the phone or door bell. People can call back or wait until you get to the door.
- See your primary care provider regularly. Talk with them about what your medications are being used for and what might be the side effects. Also talk to your primary care provider about the possibility of physical therapy to strengthen your legs.
