### **New Staff Members Welcomed**

Covenant Church is welcoming three new staff members to the church in September. Please introduce yourselves to our new staff and make them feel welcome.

Joyce Mayne will serve as our new part-time Administrative Assistant in the church office, taking on responsibilities for communications, bulletins, membership records, church calendar, and other church business. Joyce comes with experience as an administrative secretary for the Office of the State Attorney in Worcester County, Maryland. Having moved to Lancaster County with her husband a couple years ago, she is now an active member of West Willow United Methodist Church in Willow Street.

Joyce will be working Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. Volunteer secretaries will continue to answer the phone and assist with clerical jobs in the mornings from Monday through Friday.

Starting in September, most of the financial business of the church will be outsourced rather than done entirely by the church office. The local Parish Resource Center will handle the bookkeeping, and Inovo of Lancaster will take care of payroll. Carolyn Moody, the chair of our Finance Team, is assisting with this transition. Outsourcing these jobs allows for a part-time Administrative Assistant at the church and provides an economical way for delivery of these financial services.

New faces to the 9:00 a.m. contemporary service will be Yvette Diaz and Dennis Pou. The two will share the position of Music/Worship Leader, rehearsing with the Praise Team and helping to conduct contemporary worship on Sunday mornings. Yvette interned at Covenant several years ago and so is familiar with our church and community. A deacon in the United Methodist Church, she is an accomplished soloist, who has worked with several praise bands in other churches. Dennis has also worked with other praise teams and brings both keyboarding and guitar skills along with his vocal abilities. He has multi-media and sound board experience as well and will assist with preparation for the contemporary worship service. Most Sundays both will combine their talents along with the other members of the Praise Team to lead the congregation in worship.

An additional responsibility of these two musicians will be to reach out to children and youth to invite them to share their musical talents, both vocal and instrumental, in worship at Covenant. The goal will be in time to have young people involved once a month in contemporary and/or traditional worship using their musical talents for the Lord.

### Covenant Returns to Church Council Model

In July the Leadership Team met along with the Team Leaders of the various committees of Covenant and decided to return to the Church Council model as the administrative body of the church. The Leadership Team will continue on as a Visioning Team. Seeking effective communication among all leaders within the church to make decisions for moving the church forward was an impetus for this change. At the same time a separate team can remain in place to focus on visioning and strategic planning.

The Church Council will meet quarterly and conduct its first meeting on Tuesday, October 8, at 7:00 p.m. The leaders of all teams are to be part of the Church Council along with the pastors, lay leader, church treasurer, and representation from youth, United Methodist Women, and United Methodist Men. The Nominations Team will continue to be responsible for designating team leaders and church officials for 2020 who will in turn become members of the Church Council.

The current Leadership Team members will have their next meeting as the Visioning Team on Tuesday, September 10, and will plan to meeting quarterly, usually the months before Church Council meetings. As of 2020, new members for that team will be contacted by the Nominations Team rather than elected as with the Leadership Team model. The chair of the Visioning Team will then become a member of Church Council.

If you would like to serve as a leader within the church, please contact the pastor, who heads the Nominations Committee. The meetings of both the Church Council and the Visioning Team will be open to any church members who desire to attend.

### Here's To Good Health!

#### WHAT IS HOARDING?

Webster defines hoarding as the practice of collecting or accumulating something such as money or food. Hoarding is marked by an overwhelming desire to collect items and an inability to discard things that may seem useless, to such a point that the collections cause stress and start impacting person's health, career or relationships.

There really is a disorder called hoarding disorder. Mayo Clinic defines this disorder as a persistent difficulty discarding or parting with possessions because of a perceived need to save them. Hoarding can range from mild to severe.

Hoarding during the depression or war time could be seen as something that needed to be done because money and food was scarce.

Collecting things might not be a bad thing if items are kept neat and clean. We all keep things or buy things we might not really need to have but hoarding is the excessive collecting, and items are no longer usable or safe to have. Space becomes cluttered and not accessible

Hoarding often leads to unsanitary conditions and health issues. Serious and sometimes fatal illnesses are caused by rodent infestation and droppings as well as mold and bacteria. If there would be a fire, the blaze can spread quickly throughout the house and just might leave persons living there trapped inside. Emergency responders may not be able to get inside.

Children or pets could be crushed from piles of hoarded items falling on top of them. Children and animals are susceptible to respiratory illness from dust and unsanitary conditions. Mold is often found when excessive hoarding places are decluttered.

Fall is a good time to do some of that decluttering, making your home safe and healthy.
